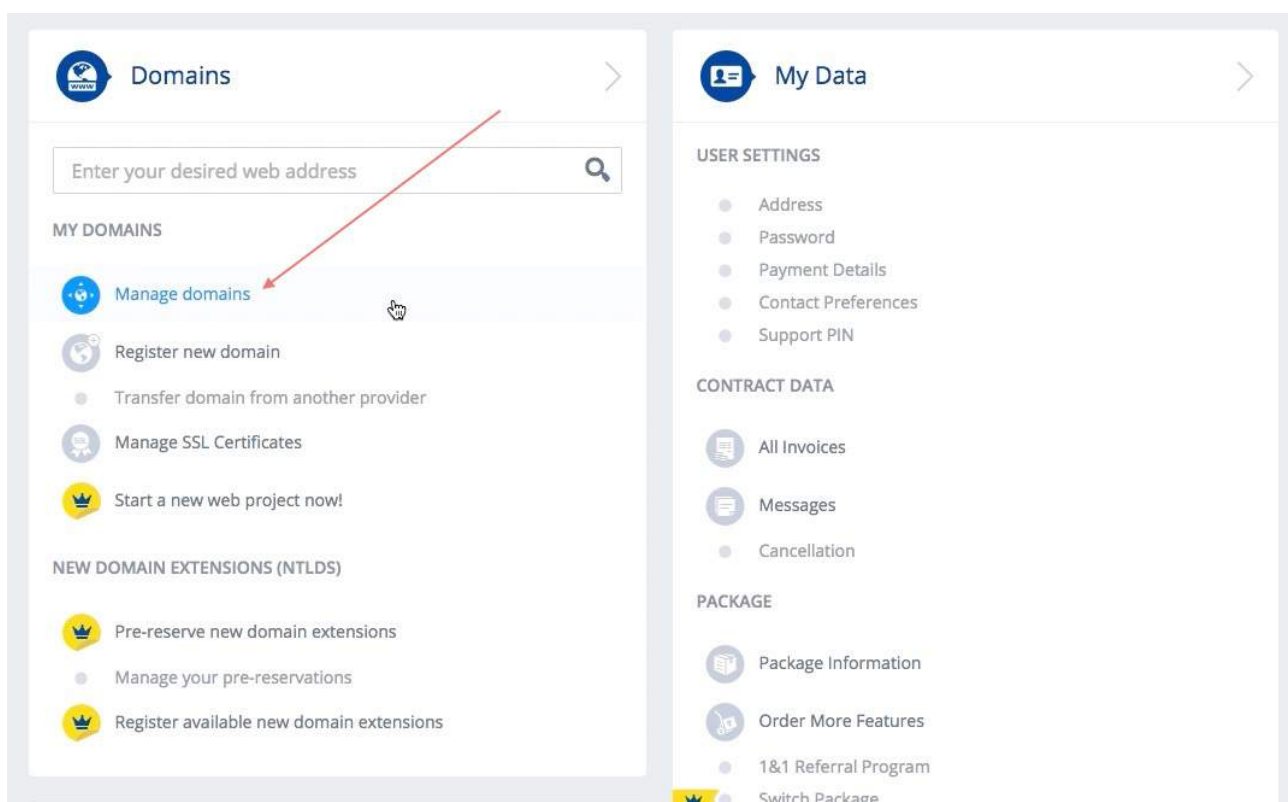

Use a 1&1 Domain With Your Viewbook Account

1 Log in to your 1&1 account and click “Manage Domains.”



2 Click on the domain you'd like to set up. When "Edit Domain Settings" appears, click it.

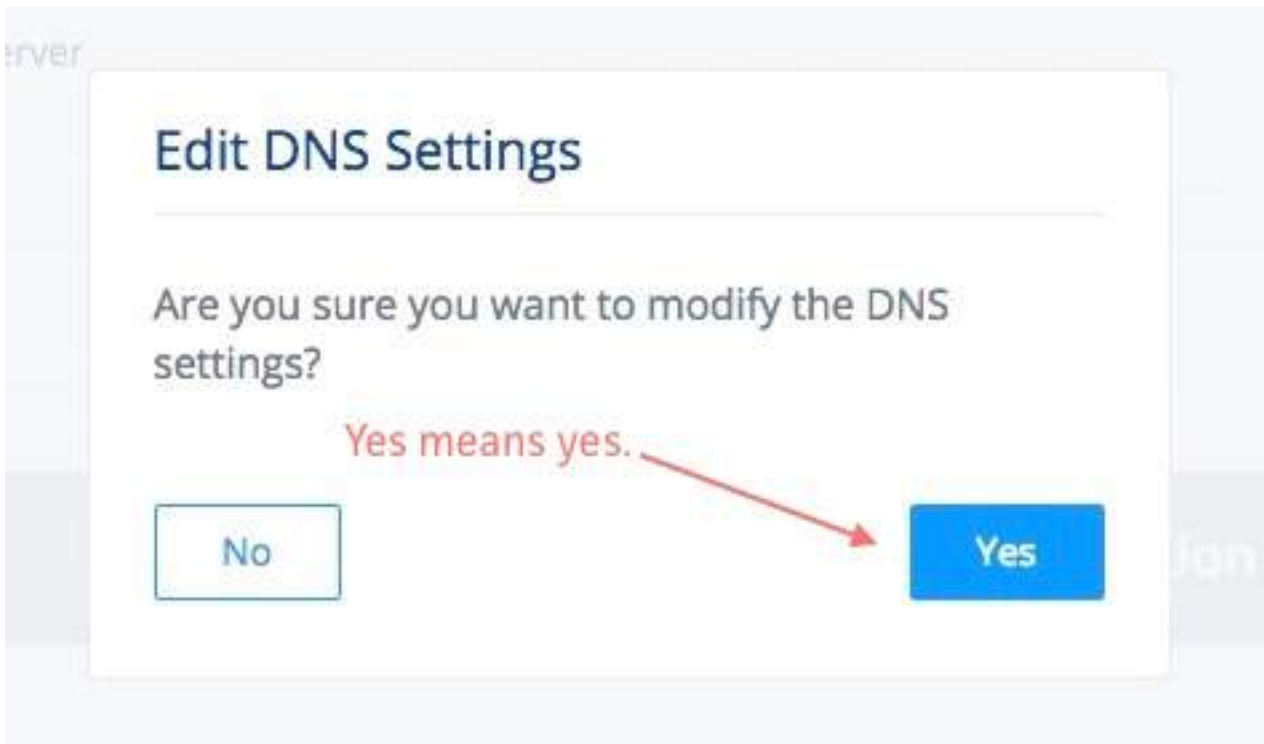

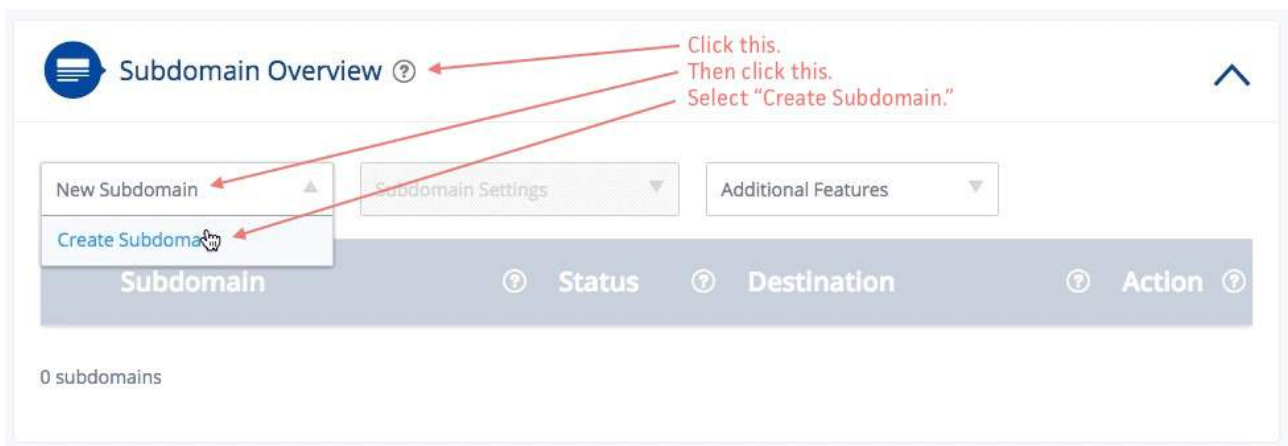

8 Type `www` in the “Create Subdomain” box. Click the “Create Subdomain” button when you’re done. You will be brought back to the main page.

Create Subdomain

Create a subdomain for your domain.

Enter a subdomain name and click on Create Subdomain. Subdomains use your main domain name and a prefix. For example, if your domain is all-is-great.com a subdomain of your domain might be blog.all-is-great.com.

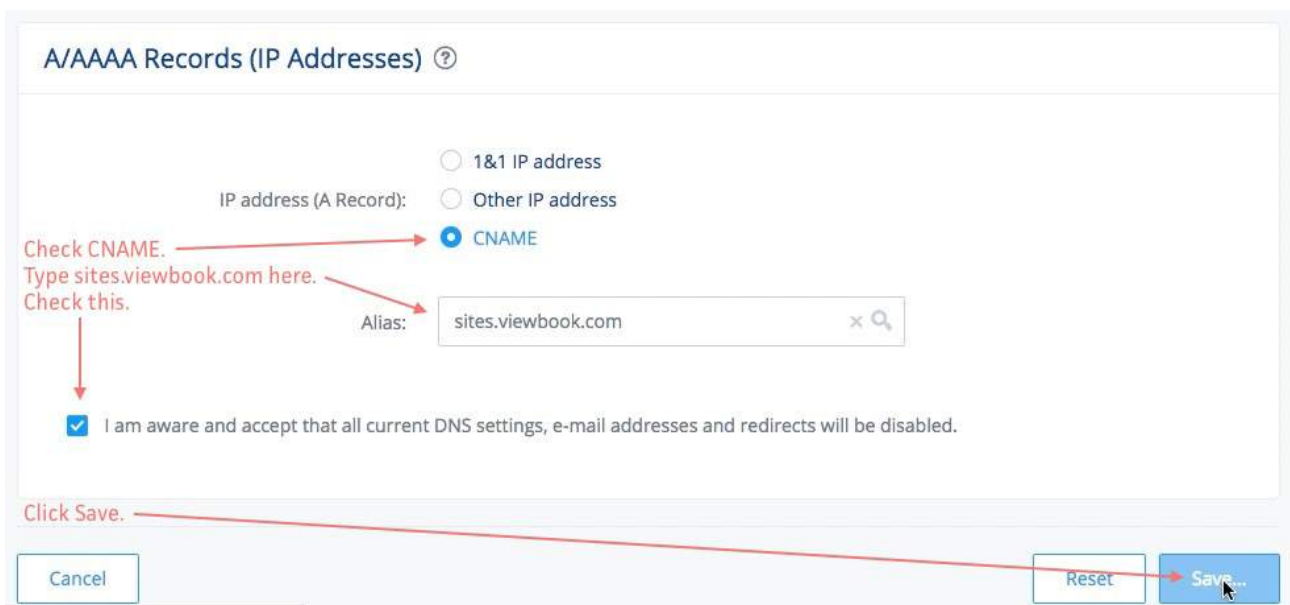
10 Click DNS settings. When “Edit” appears, click it.



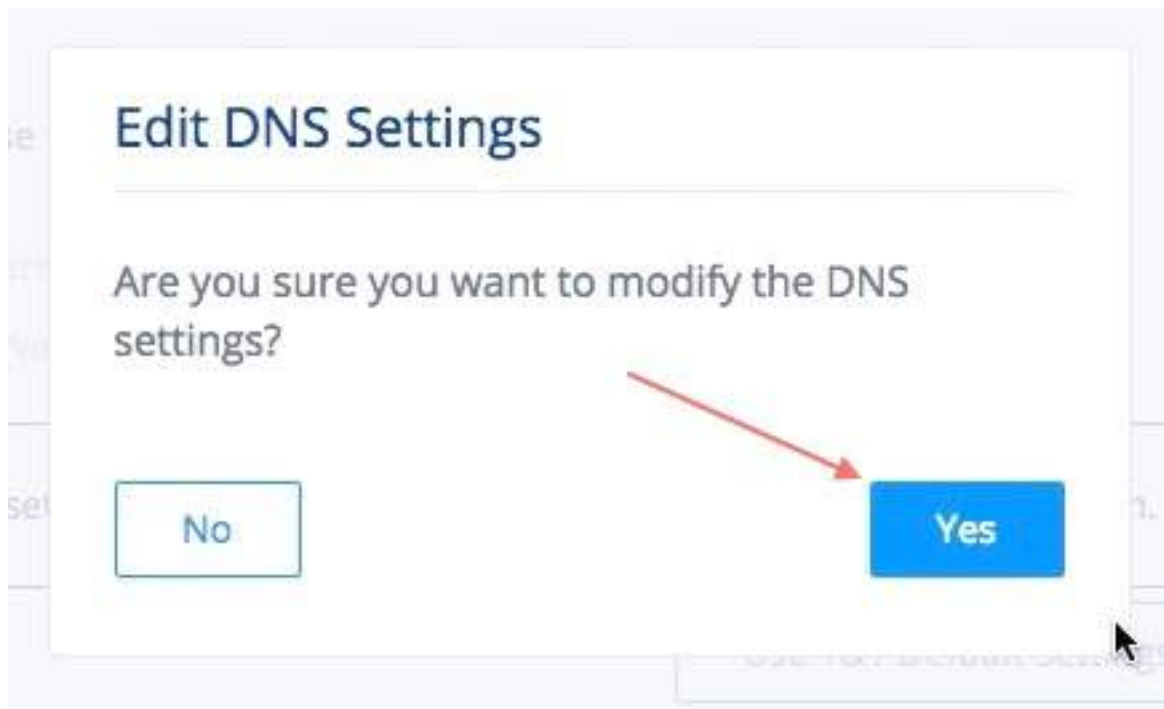
11 Check the CNAME radio button under the "A/AAAA records (IP Addresses)" heading.

12 Type sites.viewbook.com into the “Alias” field. Do not type accountname.viewbook.com or anything else. Use the exact address:sites.viewbook.com

13 Check the box confirming that you are changing DNS records, and then save.



14 Again, confirm the save. It could be a few hours before the records propagate. Be patient. Get a snack. Watch Mad Men, or something.



15 Add the domain to the Dashboard in your Viewbook account. Add the full domain name with www in front of it.
www.example.com - not example.com
Save when done.
